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## INFORMATION ABOUT WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN DOGS BODY LANGUAGE

Parents should supervise all interactions between children and dogs. A child should not be left alone with a dog unless that child has demonstrated competent dog handling skills, has a knowledge of canine communication and dog and child share a long established relationship based on mutual understanding, love and respect. Babies, toddlers and young children should never be left alone with a dog - all interactions should be actively supervised. Parents can educate their children about how to behave around dogs and how to recognise a bite risk situation. If a bite occurs the child should be reassured that she/he is not at fault. The fault lies with the owner or adult handler of the dog. If a bite occurs the child should be seen by a doctor no matter how minor the injury may seem.

- Never stare at a dog in the eyes or put their faces up to a dog's face.
- Never try to take something away from a dog.
- Never go near a dog who is eating or drinking or chewing on something.
- Never approach a dog that is on their bed
- Never try to pet a dog through a fence or in a crate.
- Never climb over a fence into a dog's yard, even if the dog is usually friendly.
- Never try to break up a dog fight or interact with dogs that are play fighting.
- Leave dogs alone that are sleeping, resting, injured, very old or with puppies.
- Teach your child about canine body language
- A safe dog is one that has a soft, relaxed, happy face and a wiggly body.



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## How Kids SHOULD NOT Interact with Dogs

Avoid taking people's food

Avoid screaming around

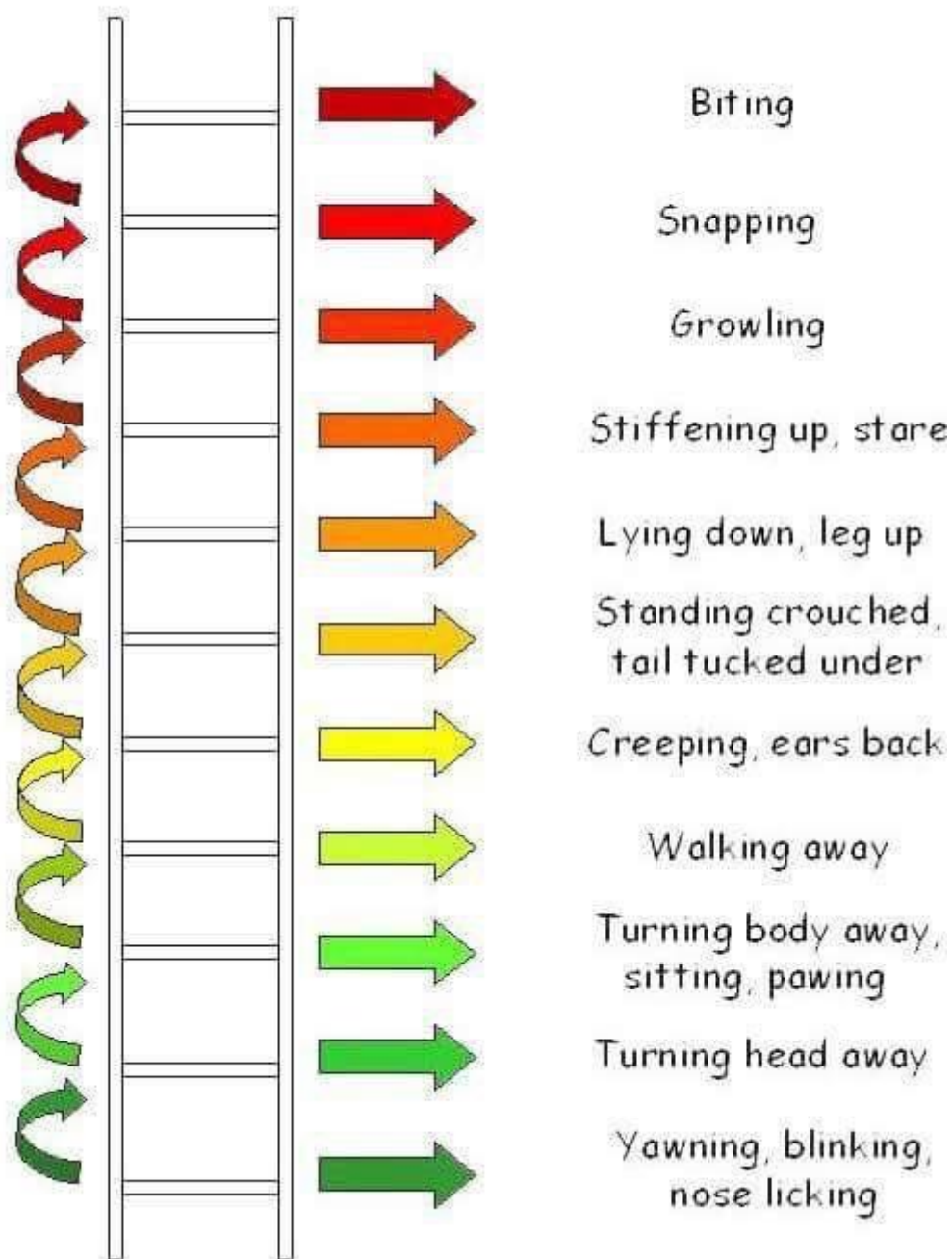


Avoid hollering and shouting. Use your "inside" voice instead.

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## THE AGREEMENT

The purpose of this application is to ensure that both the animal and potential new family are matched for a long and rewarding life together. At Bull Arab Rescue, we are committed to the safety and well-being of our rescued animals. We appreciate that all situations are different and will consider all applications equally. Submission of this application does not guarantee adoption of the stated animal, all applications are carefully reviewed and a decision is provided to the applicant as soon as practicable

I understand that I am entering into a binding agreement between myself and The Trustee for Bull Arab Rescue to adopt the rescue animal. I confirm that I have read this entire agreement carefully and fully understand all aspects before signing.

- I agree that this dog is being adopted as a companion pet.
- The dog will be provided with proper food, water, shelter, exercise and necessary veterinary treatment.
- The dog will be given a loving home and not be kept solely in the yard without interaction.
- This dog is not a gift, working animal or to be trained as a guard dog.
- I agree that this dog is **NOT** to be used for any hunting purposes.
- I agree to maintain the dog (at my own cost) and keep up to date with all immunizations and worming treatment.
- Bull Arab Rescue will provide copies of the dogs vaccination, microchip, spay/neuter and heartworm test on completion of the adoption and once the adoption fee has been paid in full.
- I understand that the adoption fee is **non-refundable**. Adoption fees are as follows unless agreed upon in writing by both myself and Bull Arab Rescue. Due to not always knowing a dogs exact date of birth, ages are determined by veterinarians.  
\$500 for dogs aged between 8 and 16 weeks  
\$450 for dogs aged between 16 weeks and 1 year old  
\$400 for dogs between 1 year and 5 years of age  
\$350 for dogs 5 years and older
- I understand that the dog's microchip will remain in the name of Bull Arab Rescue until the adoption fee has been paid in full.
- Adoption Fee payment must be paid in full unless an agreement is made between both parties in writing to state otherwise.





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- I confirm that I understand that this dog will not be sold or given away without the express written permission of Bull Arab Rescue.
- If the animal is currently under veterinary care, I confirm that I have been notified of any current Medical Conditions as far as Bull Arab Rescue has been made aware and have been provided with one course of medication that the dog is currently taking. I understand that any veterinary problems that now may arise with this dog, including serious illnesses requiring emergency care or surgery are now my responsibility, and I will bear all related costs and will provide the proper veterinary care to the animal in a timely manner.
- I understand that in the event that I can no longer keep the animal, due to injury, illness, accident or any other reason and are unable to fully care for the dog, I will notify Bull Arab Rescue immediately and will work with Bull Arab Rescue to place the dog in an approved home.
- In the event that I would like to surrender the animal back to Bull Arab Rescue, I understand and agree to complete the following steps first;
  - Contact Bull Arab Rescue and explain the situation
  - Where appropriate, Bull Arab Rescue will provide a range of options to rectify the situation and I agree to undertake all suggestions made to me.
  - In the event that all options and suggestions to rectify the situation have been exhausted and failed, Bull Arab Rescue will then accept the animal back as a surrender.
  - I understand that should I surrender the animal back to Bull Arab Rescue, I am not entitled to any refund of the adoption fees.
  - I understand that in the event of surrendering the animal back to Bull Arab Rescue, it may take time for Bull Arab Rescue to arrange a new foster home and that no timeframe guarantees can be given and that I will keep the animal in my care until a suitable foster home can be arranged.
- I understand that Bull Arab Rescue may reclaim the dog if, in its opinion, any of the above conditions are not met, or the dog is being mistreated or abused. I understand that I will be liable for any fees and costs incurred by Bull Arab Rescue out of the enforcement of this agreement. I agree that in the event that the dog is demanded back due to non-compliance with this agreement, I forfeit all rights to the dog and no compensation shall be provided.
- I agree to register my dog with my local council and maintain current dog registration on reaching 12weeks old as per the "Animal Management (Cats & Dogs) Act 2008 QLD" or applicable regional legislation. I agree to provide a copy of this registration to Bull Arab Rescue on receipt; I agree that I shall maintain this registration through the life of the dog.

- I understand that once the adoption has been completed I release Bull Arab Rescue and their estates from any and all liabilities and/or damages by fault of this dog after the time of adoption. These damages include, but are not limited to, destruction of property and/or physical damage to any person or group of





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people. In the event that the adoption occurs interstate, the point of transfer of responsibilities occurs at the delivery of the dog to transport company (i.e.: Airport / Courier).

- I have read the Child Safety and Dogs information and will ensure that I explain this to any children that will be around dog.

**By submitting this application I have considered all the aspects of responsible pet ownership including all associated vet care and associated costs and I am satisfied that I can provide a loving, forever home for this/these animals.**

**Payment Terms & Conditions:**

Upon successful application Full payment is required within Fourteen (14) Days; Full payment is required prior to picking up of dog. In special cases (e.g. pre-adoptions) a non-refundable \$150 deposit is required for an animal to be placed ON HOLD. If these terms are not met animals will be relisted as available and applications will be terminated. Applications are Valid for a period of Two (2) Weeks from time of approval only.
